



Clubs and Sports Offerings

Kingsford has 12 student clubs:

- **Anime Club** – In Anime Club we will watch, draw, and appreciate Japanese animation.
- **ASA Club** – Association of Student Artists is an association that collaborates with 5 area schools, Norway, Niagara, Florence, North Dickinson and Iron Mountain. ASA involvement is immediate with enrollment of an arts or crafts class. The benefits include monthly art exhibits, possibility of being Artist of the Month, luncheons, workshops and a yearly banquet.
- **Business Professionals of America** – is an organization dedicated to the preparation of a world-class workforce through the advancement of leadership, citizenship, academic and technological skills. BPA is the premier co-curricular CTSO (Career and Technical Student Organization) providing programs in business management, office administration, information technology and other related career fields.
- **Dance Club** – Unite students who all share a passion for dance in a fun and friendly atmosphere.
- **Drama Club** – A club in which students rehearse and perform a scripted play. Students in Drama Club learn the basics of stagecraft, self-discipline and the importance of hard work. This club promotes creativity and imaginative play, listening and observation skills, and self-confidence.
- **Environmental Club** – is for any student interested in learning about the environment and participation in service activities related to environmental issues.
- **Forensics Club** - To provide an opportunity for students to enhance their communication skills through participation in Theatre, Debate, and Speech activities.
- **Key Club** - is the oldest and largest service program for high school students. Key Club assists Kiwanis in carrying out its mission to serve the children of the world. High school student members of Key Club perform acts of service

- in their communities, such as cleaning up parks, collecting clothing and organizing food drives. They also learn leadership skills by running meetings, planning projects and holding elected leadership positions within the club.
- **Midday High Tea Book Club** - is a group dedicated to reading and discussing popular books, ranging from young adult and adult fiction to graphic novels to memoirs and everything in between.
 - **National Honor Society** - Membership in National Honor Society is an honor and is based equally upon scholarship, leadership, service, and character.
 - **Quiz Bowl Club** - Think of it as Jeopardy for high school. Questions asked in Quiz Bowl come from a large range of subjects: Literature, Science, History, Pop Culture, Sports, Math, and Civics. Every year in the fall and spring teams of four or more students compete against one another until only one team is left as the champion.
 - **Rockets for Schools Club** – provides an opportunity for students to learn about aerospace technology, scientific experiments, and space launches. Student teams construct a rocket equipped with a powerful motor that lifts it to high altitudes. In addition, students give an oral presentation and prepare a visual display of their experiment to exhibit at an event.
 - **S.A.D.D. Club** – is an acronym for Students Against Destructive Decisions. S.A.D.D.'s mission is to provide students with the best prevention tools possible to deal with issues of underage drinking, other drug use, risky and impaired driving and other destructive decisions.
 - **Spanish Club** - The Spanish Club was designed to give students an opportunity to develop their knowledge of different Spanish speaking cultures. Summer trips are planned every 3 years or so.
 - **Student Council** - is an organization in which all of its members (~six students per grade level) must be elected to their respective positions, and offers students a place to play an active role in representing their peers. Students have the opportunity to practice leadership skills and offer service to their school and community.
 - **Yearbook Club** - This club is designed to involve students in the layout and planning of the school yearbook.

Kingsford has 12 sport offerings for boys and 12 for girls:

- **Fall Sports include:** football, volleyball, girls tennis, boy/girls cross country, boys soccer, and cheer.
- **Winter Sports include:** hockey, boys/girls swimming, boys/girls basketball, wrestling, boy/girls bowling and competitive cheer.
- **Spring Sports include:** boys/girls track, boys/girls golf, girls soccer, boys tennis, softball, and baseball.
